# The Global EbA Fund has moved its application process online!

The Global EbA Fund has launched its first pilot application programme that is entirely online. All applications under the 6<sup>th</sup> cohort with the cut-off date set for 15 September 2023 will be submitted through this platform. This process applies to both general and thematic funding tracks. Application documents remain the same as before and are structured into three sections in the online platform.
