#### Problem

Coffee Farmers in Bali and East Nusa Tenggara are vulnerable to climate change

How can we co-develop EbA solutions with communities:

- Tailored capacity building
- Agroforestry demonstration plots
- Installing biogas digesters















#### Tailored Climate Field Schools



- Field schools for men and women
- Each location has a slightly different curriculum (tailored to the problem of each location)
- Activities include analyzing current trees, soil conditions, and suitable local species as shade trees
- Adaptation plans are created together with farmers and extension workers

















#### Coffee Agroforestry as Inclusive NbS/EbA



- Agroforestry designed to have multiple benefits (ecosystem services)
- Local and native shade species decided with communities
- Using traditional methods and ceremonies during the demonstration plots













## Biogas Digesters as Inclusive Technology

Biogas digesters in Bajawa have reduced the need for firewood collection (and reduce the health risks related to it) while also provide fertilizers to the farms.





















## Next steps and Key takeaways

- Next programs must focus on downstream -> how can we generate economic evidence of community-led EbA
- Many communities have their own NbS/EbA, it is about strengthening and enhancing with the right climate information





## SUNCASA is a 3-year NbS project delivered by IISD and WRI in collaboration with local partner and funds from Global Affairs Canada

- CAD 28,7 million from Global Affairs Canada
- 3 years: January 2024 March 2027
- Led by IISD and WRI with 14 local partners
- 2.2 million beneficiaries in high-flood-risk areas, with at least 50% women
- Enhancing climate adaptation, gender equality, social inclusion, and biodiversity protection in urban communities
  - Reforestation & afforestation: ~3 million trees to be planted
  - Agroforestry and urban greening: 650,000 trees
  - Buffer zone creation and alien invasive species removal

### Art with a Purpose: The River Creature Series

- Launched in April 2025, the Alexandra River Creature Series in Johannesburg is a unique initiative that blends environmental action with art.
- In collaboration with JICP and AWW, local artists and youth transformed waste from the Jukskei River into sculptures and litter traps to tackle flooding and pollution.
- Community workshops to upcycle river waste, such as eroded bricks, invasive logs, broken tiles, into impactful environmental art.
- This vibrant art pathway showcases SUNCASA's nature-based solutions in action, celebrates urban biodiversity, and boosts eco-tourism in the region.

### What are we doing in Ecuador?

4 components:

Multilevel governance
EbA measures in vulnerable
communities
Capacities for EbA
Innovative financial mechanisms



















#### Where and how?



- Province of Manabí 2 landscapes (North and South)
- Scaling up: Tosagua, Bolívar, Portoviejo, Chone
- Consolidation: Santa Ana and Jipijapa
  Geospatial analysis validated with local
  stakeholders
  - 10 ACC-AbE measures: agroforestry systems, agrobiodiversity, bamboo, beekeeping, water, cattle and goat silvopastoral systems, conservation and restoration, SFM















### Manabí - Highlights

- 2700 ha + 3000 participants in EbA measures
- 142 home gardens: Food security
- 72% of women in beekeeping: Economic autonomy
- Water guardians: water protection areas
- ✓ 3 community nurseries → local employment
- Efficient bamboo management (handicrafts, constructions), goats, microwatershed



















Beyond the numbers



- Gender co-responsibility
- Redistribution of care
- **Community leadership**
- More resilient and sustainable livelihoods















#### Nature, Climate & Gender

#### What did we learn? What did we transform?

- Inclusion is designed from the start
- Gender = efficiency,legitimacy and fairness
- Intergenerational partnerships
- Livelihoods + rights = shared resilience
















